start the campaign season. Although many engagements were initiated in the spring, some of the more decisive battles were won late in the fall, and at Trenton and Princeton, in the dead of winter. The loss at Yorktown sealed the fate of the British role in the thirteen colonies. The British people had had their fill of this war and were interested in its coming to a speedy conclusion. The negotiators in Paris had other plans. They were dragging out the process to maximize their position in obtaining all the advantages that this treaty would allow. The British Forces were still in New York City and had forts along the Ohio River. In the end, they acknowledged the United States as a separate nation but gave in to nothing else. They finally evacuated in November of 1783. Although this war was called a revolution because the colonies were declaring their independence from the mother country, it was a civil war between colonists in many places.

They are located in Killeen, Corpus Christi, Abilene and Mission. These are open to any veteran and their families. A normal plot has two positions stacked for husband and wife. Cliff stated that in one family, both husband and wife were in the service, so they each had a separate plot. If you are interested in one of these locations for your final resting place speak with Cliff or the Tx Land Board.
