

Henry Gleason

Born February 26, 1750

Died September 4, 1835

Massachusetts

Henry Gleason was born February 26, 1750 in Oxford, Massachusetts to Aaron and Eunice Elizabeth (Kinney) Gleason. Henry married Hannah Gleason (unknown year) who was from Rowe, Franklin, Massachusetts and born on March 4, 1755.

Henry served twice during the American Revolution. According to the book, Massachusetts Soldiers and Sailors in the American Revolution, Henry served as a private in Capt. Gideon Chapin's (Myrifield) company of Minute-men, which marched April 21, 1775, in response to the alarm of April 19, 1775. He served for 21 days. Then he enlisted in Capt. Samuel Taylor's company of Col. Porter's regiment on July 10, 1777 and was discharged Ang. 12, 1777, for a service record of 38 days. During his time with Col. Porter's regiment, the company marched from Charlemont to reinforce Northern army after the evacuation of Ticonderoga.

Henry died September 4, 1835 in Ulster, Ulster, New York. Hannah Gleason died on July 2, 1835, in Halfmoon, Saratoga, New York
